

The North Carolina Chapter of the ACC is proud to announce a special grant being offered to a cardiovascular organization in need of funding to create a program with a goal of reducing cardiovascular health disparities in the state of North Carolina.

This is for a one-year grant, with potential for renewal, in a competitive process. Priority will be given to projects with paths to scalability and independent sustainability.

In order to apply, you must be a current North Carolina Chapter ACC member. The grant request form must be completed in full, accompanied by an executed Grant Agreement and received by the NCCACC Grant Committee by September 1, 2021.

Requester must submit the following documents with the Grant Request:

- W9 form
- program objectives
- detailed proposed budget
- outcomes and purpose of project
- CV of all involved in project

In the grant application, please address the following:

- Both your and your organizations experience in this type of initiative.
- Is there someone in your service area already working on this need who and what?
- How is your proposal different?
- What is the population you are targeting?

Deadline: Please submit Grant Request and all required documents by September 1.

**Amount:** The requested grant amount may be up to \$25,000 for a one-year project.

<u>Award date:</u> The Chapter plans to award the grant to the recipient in person at the NC & SC Chapters of the ACC 28th Annual Joint Meeting, September 17-19 at the Omni Grove Park Inn, Asheville, NC.

All grant submissions will be reviewed by the NC Chapter Grant sub-committee. Submission of this Grant Request and the foregoing documentation does not guarantee approval of the request. Not to be used for indirect costs or overhead.

NCCACC will only pay grants upon approval by the NCCACC Grant Committee and after the Grant Agreement has been countersigned by NCCACC. The NCCACC Grant Committee reserves the right to award less than the amount requested.
